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# FRIENDS OF JESUS

This material is a fun way that you can disciple children ages 6 to 11 who have accepted Christ. Remember that a discipler is not only one who teaches but someone who shares his life with his disciples.

The children you disciple will be watching, imitating and asking you about their doubts. Pray for them and treat each child's situation individually. If a child is absent from a class, do not hesitate to visit them to see what happened and give them the lesson they missed.

This material consists of six lessons, each of which has various activities for you to do with the child(ren) you are discipling. To begin, make sure everyone has a Bible. Have some extra Bibles to lend to those who do not have one so they can work more easily.

The following several pages are some suggestions/ideas on how to present your class each time you meet. From page 7 onward, you will find the answers to the exercises on the children's sheets. We trust that the Lord will help you carry out this important work.



# SUGGESTIONS

## For discipleship lessons

Here are some suggestions for leading these discipleship lessons with your students. We suggest that these groups consist of no more than 6 children. This will allow you to have more personal interaction with them and be able to address their questions and concerns more directly.

These lessons can be organized in many different ways. Below we have presented one way in which you can organize a 40-minute class. The lesson is divided into six steps, which give a maximum amount of time to develop the lesson with various activities for each day.

As an extra activity or as homework you can have your students color the drawings on the covers of each lesson.

### Step One: Opening

Start by welcoming the students by playing a game that is energetic or a fun ice breaker game. (5 minutes)

### Step Two: Prayer

Invite the children to pray. Explain to the children that the only way to communicate with God is by praying, read Jeremiah 33:3. Prayer is very important in the Christian life. Teach them that we close our eyes when we pray so we are not distracted by what is around us and we bow our heads as a sign of submission to God. The following are ideas of ways to have your prayer time for each day that you meet with your students. Pray that the children will become friends and that they will feel free to share within the group.

(5 minutes)

**Day 1:** Pray the Lord's Prayer and explain to the children that this prayer was taught by Jesus and is a perfect model of how we should approach God (lead the prayer and have the children repeat after you).

**Day 2:** Ask the children to share a need or something that worries them, explain that you will present these requests to God. Begin the prayer by giving the children a few seconds for them to pray quietly and make their requests to God and then pray aloud for each request.

**Day 3:** Ask the children if they are grateful to God and why. Then invite the children to hold hands and pray a prayer of gratitude for the care that God has lavished upon them.

**Day 4:** Ask the children for a volunteer who would like to lead the prayer and allow them to pray aloud. If no one volunteers, ask the child you think is most comfortable and offer to help them lead the prayer. Let them begin and be prepared to help them in case they stop and don't know how to continue to complete the prayer. When the prayer is over, be sure to thank the student for their participation.

**Day 5:** Organize the children in pairs. Have them tell their requests to each other. Then have them pray for their partners request(s). If their partner doesn't have a request, have them pray for their partners family, health, studies, etc.

**Day 6:** Invite your pastor, or a leader of the church, to be present at this last meeting. Ask them to congratulate the children for their effort in participating in these discipleship lessons and then have them begin this final lesson with prayer.

# Step Three: Praise

After prayer, sing a song that goes along with the lesson you are going to have that day. (5 minutes)

# Step Four: Bible Lesson

To present the Bible lessons you can use different resources. If you have the Jesus Film on video, you may want to use it in some of the lesson. It's a great way get your students attention and help them remember more clearly the events in the life of Jesus. (15 minutes)

**Lesson 1:** To begin the first lesson you can take advantage of the Jesus Film and show the first 10 minutes of the movie where the purpose of the life of Jesus is explained. Then, take the opportunity to clarify any questions that the children may have. If you do not have the Jesus Film summarize the first two chapters of the Gospel of Luke 1:26-35, 2:1-7. Using pictures or other objects to visualize your summary will help the children remember better what they learn.

**Lesson 2:** For the second lesson, just like the previous one, you can present the Jesus Film, showing the part with the story of Zacchaeus, or you can ask some children or young people to act it out in a few minutes.

**Lesson 3:** This lesson is about the Lord's Prayer. Begin by reading the Lord's Prayer and then review the meaning of each phrase with the children to make sure they understand their meaning. For example: "Our Father . . ." Why do we say "Our Father"? "in heaven,..." Why do we say that God is in heaven? etc. Then explain to them Matthew 4:4. Make it clear that prayer and reading the Bible are important if we want to find the treasures God has for us. Encourage the children to memorize the Lord's Prayer.



**Lesson 4:** Use the Jesus Film showing the scene of Jesus feeding the 5000 or you can narrate the story. Have the child sit outside on the grass, like the people in the story and use objects (plastic fish and bread) to demonstrate the story. Then share a snack of cookies and juice with them. Pray to close out the lesson. You can use the passage in John 6:1-15.

**Lesson 5:** Begin by telling the story of Jesus' Temptation in Matthew 4:1-11. While discussing the 3 questions on the children's worksheets, have them draw, on a separate piece of paper, a large hand like the one that appears on the student worksheet. Ahead of time, prepare for each student pieces of paper that have the phrases that are on each finger of the hand that is on the student's worksheet. As you explain what is written on each finger, have your students stick the corresponding phrase on each finger.

**Lesson 6:** This lesson is based on Galatians 6: 1-10. Explain to the children what it is to "do good" and who the "family of believers" is. Then, make a plan with your students to help someone in the church who is sick or needs help. If there isn't someone in the church that needs help, think of someone who isn't a Christian and has a need that you can help with.

## Step Five: Practical Activity

Distribute the children's worksheets for them to complete. Everyone should work on them at the same time. Remember that if they are new children they may not know much about the Bible. (10 minutes)

## Step Six: Final Prayer

Pray as a group for your students and their families. (5 minutes)

Satan tempted Jesus to turn stones into bread. What did Jesus say to Satan? Read Matthew 4:4 in your Bible and find the answer.

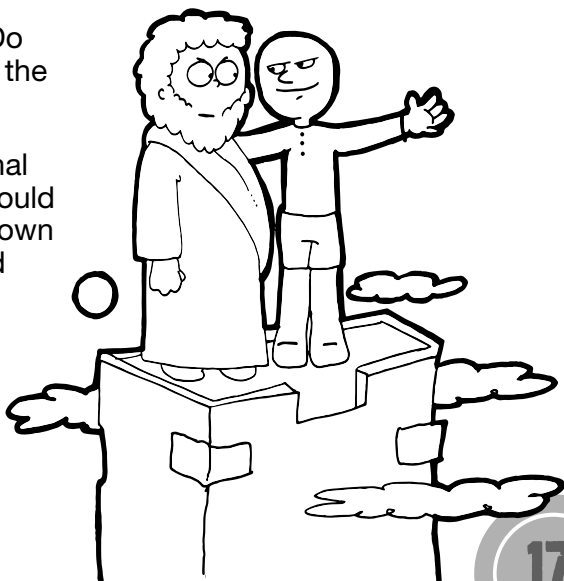
**Answer:** "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God'." Matthew 4:4.
